Impeachment Trial of President Emma Velez- President of Student Government Association

April 10, 2012

8:01 P.M.

1. Vice President Cook calls trial to order at 8.01. Vice President Cook informs the body, President Velez, and the visitors that the only people who will have speaking rights are the members of the Student Senate and President Emma Velez.
2. Vice President Cook asked Sec. Ross to read the roll. Sec. Ross reads the roll.
 - a. Those present at the time of roll call: Sen. Kristi Garr, Sen. Sadie Kaserman, Sen. Katy McDonald, Sen. Naveen Ramkumar, Sen. Hau-Can Wong, Sen. German Martinez, Sen. Caleb Howard, Sen. Edgars Boitmanis, Sen. Tyler Johnson, Sen. Jonathan Clour, Sen. Phillip Nguyen, Sen. Anthony England, Sen. Erica Olivarria, Sen. Robin Ladd, Sen. Clayton Puckett, Sen. Beatriz Martinez, Sen. Ciera Terry, Sen. Theresa Hottle, Sen. Terrence Craft.
 - b. Those not present at the time of roll call: Sen. Amy Scheentra
3. Vice President Cook moves to the reading of the Resolution of Impeachment which is the duty of the Secretary of Senate to read in its entirety. Sec. Ross read Resolution 011 (Please see attachment for Resolution 011). (21m37sec)
4. Vice President Cook moves to the reading of the Steering Report and ask for a representative to step forward. Sen. Olivarria speaks on behalf of the Steering Committee. (Please see attachment for Steering Committee Report) (4m52sec)
5. Vice President Cook Moves to the trial to President Velez rebuttal. Vice President Cook reminds the body and visitors that President Velez gets as much time as she deems necessary. Vice President Cook recognizes



- 33 President Velez, and she assumes the floor for her rebuttal which is a
34 follows:
- 35 a. President Velez: (17m:58sec)
 - 36 b. With the end of her rebuttal, President Velez steps away from the
37 floor.
- 38 6. Sen. England motions for debate to follow immediately after 3rd round of
39 discussion. Seconded. Consent. Passed.
- 40 7. On information to the chair, Sen. Olivarria asks if Vice President Cook could
41 explain debate to the senators.
- 42 a. Cook: what will happen in the debate is you will get a few mins to
43 caucus with each side. There will be a pro- side and a con-side. Each
44 side will get to pick 3 representatives. Each of those representatives
45 will get 4 mins each. They can yield their time to the people who are
46 left. Our rotation to speak will go Pro, Con, Pro, Con, Con, Pro.
- 47 8. Vice President Cook moves into discussion. Much like the regular Senate
48 Sessions each member of Senate will get 1 minute each round of
49 discussion. Floor is open for discussion.
- 50 9. FIRST ROUND OF DISCUSSION:
- 51 10.Sen. England motions to extend the speaking rights during discussion by 1
52 ½ minutes. Seconded. Objection heard. VP Cook asks for a roll call from Sec.
53 Ross.
- 54 a. Sen. Ladd Motions to take this vote by hand. Seconded. Consent.
55 Passed.
 - 56 b. Hand Vote: 14 Yes; 5 No. PASS.
 - 57 c. Time extended to 2 ½ mins.
- 58 11.FIRST ROUND OF DISCUSSION: (14m45sec)
- 59 a. Sen. Johnson: (NV) Senators, the constitution is set in place to limit
60 the powers, it should limit the powers. “So, basically, if it doesn’t say
61 it, then you can’t do it. As for the elections, this is not double
62 jeopardy. Just because the election commissioners say. Yields the
63 rest of time.



- 64 b. Sen. B. Martinez: (v) I just want to let it be known, that all those that
65 are here listening today to just realize that loyalty comes two sided. If
66 you are asking for loyalty from your followers who support you, you
67 have to have loyalty to them too. You can't have loyalty to represent
68 their voices; you have to have loyalty when you are working a
69 mandated twenty hours that it says in the constitution, you are
70 working those twenty hours. You are documenting those twenty
71 hours. You are making sure that you are doing it in the right way.
72 Because, every person here in Senate has come here from 7:30 to 10
73 o'clock some nights. And we are here every day working. Some of us
74 have to work 23 hours a week just to pay for school and we still are
75 here. It is my loyalty to those who work to show up every night,
76 regardless of what other complications I may have. I have to show up
77 on time. And that loyalty to them I expect returned. And at the job
78 that I preside at, at the bookstore, we clock in and clock out. So for
79 people to not be able to do the same thing as members of executive,
80 it's a pretty sad day when we give these members of the student
81 body to have these high position, be paid, to have these luxuries of
82 having just this prestigious job. You can't document your hours? You
83 can't email and correspond? You can't come to us and show us that
84 you have been working? It should be very easy. You should be over
85 whelming us with evidence, if you are working 20 hours a week. I
86 could come tonight with the 23 hours I've been working since last
87 year when I started working at the bookstore. And I can document a
88 lot of stuff that I have done. And it's just an OCU book store, it's not
89 something ...(?)... but, 20 hours a week, there is a lot of work that can
90 be done, you should be over whelming us with evidence.
- 91 c. Sen. Garr: (V) The only thing that I really have to say is that as a
92 Senate member, when I was elected, well I actually had an interview,
93 I was told what I had to do, the requirements that I would have or I
94 would be removed. So each semester, if you didn't have the



95 requirements, if I didn't produce two items of legislation, if I had so
96 many absences, u would be removed. So, I just feel that that should
97 be the same with whatever the position is, because they know what
98 the position they are going for.

99 d. Sen. Howard: (V) First off I want to make it clear to senate that
100 tonight we are voting on the whole document. We either charge
101 President Velez with everything that is in this document or we
102 release her of all charges. Also, if she is impeached, she will not be
103 able to hold office next semester. So keep that in mind. Therefore, if
104 you have a problem with any section of the resolution, I urge you to
105 think hard before you vote yes. A yes vote will charge President Velez
106 with all the charges listed in the resolution. As you will hear tonight,
107 myself and many other senators have drafted arguments of proof
108 against what is claimed in the resolution. President Velez is not
109 saying that everything in the resolution is wrong, or that she is
110 perfect. For as you can see, there are a few issues in here that were
111 admitted that a better process could have been executed. But the
112 President has committed to me and the OCU Student Community
113 that if she were allowed her next term, methods would be put into
114 place to ensure a more efficient administration, where such errors
115 will be less likely. Keep in mind that we are all human, we all make
116 mistakes. And as students, we are not pros in politics, we are
117 learning. That's all I have to say.

118 e. Sen. Hottel: (NV) I would like to point out the flip side to Sen.
119 Howard's argument. If you vote no, you are clearing her of all
120 charges.

121 f. Sen. Ladd: (V) I am here today to remind you of something, we are
122 the voice of the students. We are the guardians of every single
123 person who has voted for us. We were the ones who were chosen to
124 make this decision. Sometime we have to force people to be real. It
125 breaks my heart to say this; the president that I campaigned for my



126 sophomore year cared about SGA. She cared about the student body.
127 And I believed her. But I cannot stand here, as a leader, and say that I
128 have confidence, in the fact that I have heard law suits are going to
129 be threatened. When all I have seen is in fighting and there has been
130 nothing but divisiveness. I cannot stand here and be confident. This is
131 a grave decision. But it is more important to me regardless of
132 personal relations, regardless of how I am affected, that we have a
133 leader that we can trust. Is it more important to you and the student
134 body to have someone in office, or to have someone in office that we
135 as a Senate, as the representatives of the Student body can trust?

136 g. Sen. Olivarria: (V) I would like to speak to Sen. Howard's point, about
137 the fact that nobody is perfect and that we are students and that we
138 are learning. I believe that this is a very good point and it's true. But
139 at the same time, I would like to remind you that this is not play
140 money that we play with. SGA deals with over \$200,000 a year. And
141 that is a lot of money, and that is your money, senators and visitors,
142 that you are paying the university to come here and for people to
143 make mistakes with. I understand that no one is perfect. But we
144 should be trying really hard to uphold the constitution and
145 everything SGA stands for.

146 h. Sen. England: (V) I would like to first say that I think it's great that we
147 finally got the members of Executive Branch to come to a Senate
148 meeting. I think it's sad that it took an impeachment hearing for
149 them to actually attend. There is a lot of information that I have
150 gotten through my investigation and I am going to try and present as
151 much as I can. In our steering meetings I sincerely believe that
152 President Velez came to the Hearing and approached us with a plan
153 on how she was going to fix these things and admitted to her wrong
154 doings, that we would without a doubt, not be here today. Instead
155 there were rough documents rushed, and I think Dee Llenusa was in
156 her office until 10:30, putting in documents. I have emails where she



157 said that the budget was being changed before her eyes, and Corey
158 Hill and Harmony Cheetal, who is a justice on the Student Court, are
159 both witnesses to that. The Star Connect expense for the food for a
160 meetings was removed from the budget the day before the Senate
161 Hearing. And I also have documentation that that was purchased by a
162 credit card, which break the new Business rules. But President Velez
163 told me , Kate Adams, who should be listed as the president of Star
164 Connect on involved but was never changed. Emma Velez to her to
165 use the credit card, to get the card from the Dean of Students, Liz
166 Donnelly, which violated the principles that Emma should have
167 known. In regard to Matt Harney, who was almost impeached
168 before, resigned, do to similar charges. Because his only defense was
169 that the account budgeted for did not go negative. The second that
170 the 3 iPads were purchased, we were over by more than \$300.00.
171 Senate only allocated \$1500.00, we went into the red immediately,
172 when those were purchased. However, Katie's iPad was not put into
173 the working budget until Feb. 21st. I think that is completely wrong.
174 The payment plan existed since November, yes, that that is 3 months
175 late. But why was it just now recorded? And I also have an email
176 saying that the Sec. of Finance attempted to back date these
177 payments. I think that I completely wrong and we can't stand for
178 that.

- 179 i. Sen. G. Martinez: (NV) I would just like to say that the majority of
180 steering are authors to the resolution and I think that presents a
181 conflict of interest. There are evidence to the validity of their pay, for
182 example, Ryan Swartzman just organized and executed OKC One
183 Give. And these salaries were approved by us.
- 184 j. Sen. Edwards: (V) Senators, the constitution was created for reason
185 and rules we can abide by. We have rules of the constitutions and
186 before any takes office. The process is , if you don't follow the rules,
187 you should be removed. This one time, people are going ask, Did we



188 take a stand? If we look by and watch it happen, or did we take a
189 stand. I'm not going to debate, all I want is for you senators to do, no
190 matter which way you are voting, is to at least take a stand.

191 k. Sen. Craft: (V) To my fellow senators, I would just like to say that this
192 whole semester, Emma has reminded us what integrity is. I came
193 here tonight, and I read this resolution, it is personal, it is bias and
194 opinionated. This is not what senate is about. If you cannot resolve
195 your issues in the personal realm, you have to do it here. I question
196 your integrity.

197 l. Sen. Kaserman: (V) As a member of steering I sat in these meetings
198 and I had a really hard time trying to decide if I was going to support
199 this or not. But, as you can see, my name is on this resolution. I look
200 at all these charges and as somebody who likes to follow rules, can
201 say "let's just forget about it." I like Emma personally, this is nothing
202 personal. And I am getting a little bit sick of people saying this is
203 personal and fellow senators have a problem with Emma personally.
204 If any of us were to not do our constitutional duties we would be
205 removed, and I wouldn't take it personally. And as far as the
206 argument that this is bias because the members of steering are the
207 ones standing up and doing this, like I said, it took me so long to
208 decide that I was going to be a sponsor on this. So just because I am
209 on steering doesn't mean that I am bias to this.

210 m. Sen. Edgars: (NV) I would just like to say that after hearing both sides
211 there were some mistakes. But this is not significant enough for
212 impeachment. I don't see misuse of funds at all. With regard to the
213 salaries, we passed them. In regard to the 3rd iPad, President Velez
214 should be commended because she found a way for SGA to make
215 that money back. I think that this hearing is more crystalizing the we
216 have a discourse between our branches. And in the future we need
217 to work more closely to fulfill the purpose of SGA.



218 n. Sen. Terry: (NV) first of all, the impeachment process is in the
219 constitution for a reason. It wouldn't have been given to us if it
220 wasn't there to enforce. All the things that we have discussed. We
221 are intelligent enough to represent the Student Body accurately.

222 12. SECOND ROUND DISCUSSION

223 a. Sen. Johnson: (NV) I would like to speak to Caleb's point. My name is
224 on the resolution and I am not on steering. This isn't anything
225 personal, I haven't even really ever talked to Emma, I haven't really
226 campaigned for any special presidential candidate during elections.
227 This isn't personal. And it hurt me for people to say that this is a
228 personal thing. I have nothing to gain from this, I'm graduating. So,
229 this is based on facts and they need to be up held.

230 b. Sen. Garr: (V) I also don't think this was a question of integrity or is
231 biased because everything has been taken from the constitution. This
232 is a really hard thing to do and I couldn't imagine being on the other
233 side. But, we were all voted on by the entire students to represent
234 them. So our view is somewhat the view of the students. I have only
235 been around Senate for a year and this is the first year that I voted
236 during elections and I voted with information about the candidates.
237 And it's our job to do our job. If everything isn't being filed, we have
238 to protect the student body and it's money. And it's not personal, it's
239 really hard to be in this position, but we have to.

240 c. Sen. Howard: (V) I don't know if any of Senate actually hear President
241 Velez's rebuttal, but I'm trying to figure out what rules were actually
242 broken. All of the proof that she gave kinda discounted a lot of them,
243 and we are going to go through them all and discuss. I want to
244 remind Senate of Anthony's statement earlier about if an idea was
245 brought to the steering committee on how to fix some of these
246 things this hearing wouldn't have happened. Well, charges were not
247 presented at the hearing. There were no formal charges given to
248 Emma Velez at the hearing, therefore she had no idea what she had



249 to go off of and what they thought she did wrong. And so she could
250 not fix them at the hearing. Charges were not given until last Friday
251 after 5. Also, just so you guys know, when we had the audit last
252 semester, the audit sub- committee rated the financial standing of
253 SGA as “Excellent”. The financial sub- committee rated the financial
254 standing of SGA as “Excellent”. So if they are bringing up motions
255 about that, saying that it was bad then and didn’t fix it, well we said it
256 was excellent. So we are going to start going through again every
257 single charge in this resolution and discount it and show the proof of
258 why the President of SGA should not be impeached. And we will hold
259 that off for debate.

260 d. Sen. Ladd: (V) We should not be here tonight, we shouldn’t, we
261 shouldn’t . But the Steering Committee decided to move this through
262 because they wanted you all and everyone else to hear what was
263 going on. That is exactly why they did this. It was not for alleviating
264 an grievance an alleged bias and I as a member of the Steering
265 Committee can say that.

266 e. Sen. England: (V) Okay let me first off address the audit because
267 that has been misquoted several times and I think that is
268 disrespectful to my committee who worked really hard on that.
269 Financial condition was in the first section that that is what was rate
270 “Excellent”. Right now we still have \$17,000 left in our budget which
271 is a little more then 2/5’ and all that money is going to be absorbed if
272 none of it is used. There was no way for my committee to know that
273 all of those entries in the budget were not actual payroll expenses.
274 The iPad wasn’t recorded until Febuary. We had no idea that that
275 was even floating around, and that we had bought three iPads. The
276 NAS donation wasn’t even until March, during formal campaigning.
277 Like the Star Connect funding, it received funding in allotments in the
278 Fall because it was supposed to be a student organization in the
279 Spring. But then they use the executive budget to fund it. Like, how



280 does that work? And then they got allotments for Okie Fest which
281 was put on by SGA. It's a huge circle of funding that's not right. No
282 student organization gets the same benefit and I don't think that is
283 fair. And I think that we have to at least stand for that. Only one set
284 of the minuets that were supplied to us were actually emailed out. I
285 only have one email verification from Dee. The rest of incomplete.
286 On average they are missing 3 reports, no roll call, and I think that
287 they all look very similar. We have no idea when these mins were
288 written, there is no email verification, and none of that was supplied
289 to us. I feel like there is no validity in those minutes. Second,
290 according to an email to Dee Llenusa, time sheets were supposed to
291 be submitted to Amy Herringer in her office. Emma Velez did not
292 mention that at all in here report. Yet she says that they were fiscally
293 responsible with salaries. I don't think that was right and I don't
294 think that was followed . Three, the excuse of the Exec. meeting on
295 March 3rd, that they were scouting for a Student Art Initiative, first of
296 all March 3rd is Saturday so there wasn't an exec meeting on there.
297 But secondly I have an email to Dee stating that the meeting was
298 canceled. Which to me looks like a lie. Four, how many students in
299 our audience today can say that SGA purchased and personally
300 financed them and put an iPad on lay away for them? I would love to
301 get an iPad and I would love to set up a payment plan, but we don't
302 offer that. SGA's purpose in not to fund personal property for
303 students. We don't run a bank , we are not a credit card company.
304 It's not okay to give student's iPads and Senate , when did Senate
305 ever approve the purchase of the property and then the immediate
306 disposal of that property? That's not right, we have the authority to
307 do that, and then don't. Six, I have heard several reports that Emma
308 Velez came with a tape recorder to our closed Senate Meeting and
309 immedatly played if for her Exec and for people who wanted to hear
310 it. What kind of disrespect is that?



- 311 f. Sen. Olivarria: (V) I would just like to speak to one thing that Sen.
312 Boitmanis said about the \$10,000 over statement of salaries and how
313 that money has been saved which was said in a good light. I would
314 like to remind senators that we ran out of money in senate this
315 semester. We had organization who came to us and we couldn't give
316 them as much as we wanted to because we had no money. While
317 there was \$10,000 just sitting there that really couldn't be used and I
318 just feel that wasn't right and I feel that we should be giving our
319 organizations more money because they are the students and that is
320 what makes up this school. It's STUDENT Government Association,
321 lets give money to the students.
- 322 g. Sen. G. Martinez: (V) I just want to follow up on something that was
323 said from Sen. Howard earlier and that was that a lot of this stuff is
324 stuff that may or may not be true. Also, if we are here representing
325 our student organizations, recognize that you are elected to serve
326 the student government association and student body as a whole, I
327 have had multiple constituents come up to me and feel that the job
328 that Emma Velez has done this year has been exceptional and they
329 don't want me to vote for her impeachment. Second of all I want to
330 talk to the fact of the \$1000 contribution to NAS during formal
331 campaigning, this is just my personal opinion, I don't think that
332 \$1000 is enough for that, I don't think there is a very valid
333 explanation there. There is also the statement of the use of that
334 \$1000 to buy of a student organization of 15- 20 people is
335 inconsistent and I couldn't see this happening. Next, the use of the
336 iPads , I think that Edgars said that it was good that Emma found a
337 way to make up that money. And the difference between the past
338 president that was impeached and Emma is that he knowingly paid
339 and used that credit card and Emma Velez didn't intend of buying
340 that third iPad or , the original intent was not for Katie Alsup to buy
341 that. Over the gross overstatement of salaries, yeah we could have



342 used that for other reasons but I would have over stated that much
343 then be in the deficit.

344 h. Sen. Kaserman: (V) Okay I have heard a few point on how that
345 \$10,000 is going to roll over, I am not exactly sure if that is true. I
346 know that if we were to not spend all of our money for Senate, it
347 wouldn't roll over to the next year. Over the semester it does. I was
348 also going to talk about how the money that was used for salaries,
349 the iPad, \$10,000 is floating around; Exec. or everyone who is paid or
350 stipend or whatever the only represent .0005% of the student body
351 and they are getting a lot of money. But if senate were to have that
352 money, a lot more people would have been effected. I would also like
353 to point out the election misconduct, yes, we are not trying to double
354 jeopardy charge her for an election violation, the reason this was
355 provided was that it kinda shows that she wasn't reading the
356 constitution, knowing that only current student, I think that is kinda
357 defined. I was a part of Sarah Cook's campaign, this exact thing did
358 happen, we saw a the person who was not a current student, we
359 screen shotted it and I sent it to Sarah and Sarah went and turned it
360 in. So if Sarah can do that, I don't know why Emma couldn't do the
361 same thing. I think that this entire resolution, people keep saying
362 that there are flaws with it, there were a lot of things that we left out
363 because we were unsure of, but all the thing that currently stand in
364 the resolution we are confident they occurred.

365 i. Sen. Terry: first I would like to say that, yes, Senate is responsible for
366 voting yes on all budgets, that these budgets were voted on by
367 student Senate and approved by Student Senate. The way the budget
368 were used after they were approved however was not part of
369 Student Senate's decision.

370 j. Sen. B. Martinez: (V) I would like to first start off just to enlighten
371 people that in Emma's speech, she said many times, " let it be
372 known" and the entire time I was here, we wanted to know. We



373 wanted her to communicate with us, we wanted her to be here, and
374 she wasn't here. Now she's letting it be known when the charges are
375 against her. And I don't know if everyone was able to see the
376 Presidential Salaries, (\$9158.00) ... (?).... The person she appointed to
377 take minutes at every meeting was paid \$1921.0 to take minutes. To
378 do what our Secretary, Jalisa Ross does and she has done an amazing
379 job with it and has taken them every single time. We meet a lot and
380 she does a good job and I want you to realize how much money is
381 being paid. \$1000 is a lot of money. And Emma approved 137 hours
382 that is a lot of money. That is disrespectful to me personally I work a
383 lot and it is really disrespectful for you to say that 137 hours of my
384 time isn't work being of significant value? What are we hear for? I
385 mean do we all have \$1000 to just roll around in? I don't. and that's
386 why I'm working, because I don't. And it's unfair for , this \$10,000
387 that we are not sure on, we are not sure that we are going to have
388 next year. They actually do not know, they haven't showed me that it
389 will actually be here next year. I will be here next semester, and it
390 better show up because I have been working and I want the money
391 to show up for every student has paid for in contribution for student
392 organization. I set through every bill, we had to cut peoples bills and
393 they just wanted to use it for a good cause.

394 13.Sen. Howard asked the chair on information if the trial was on the same
395 time constraints as a regular Senate Session. The Vice President Cook,
396 informed the body that it isn't on the same time constraints and continued
397 with the Second Round of Discussion.

398 a. Sen. Hottle: (NV) I would like to speak to the points being made
399 about this being bias. This is a really awful position to be in. there are
400 a lot of documents that were looked at when creating this
401 Resolution. Sen. England sits in the steering committee and wrote in
402 the resolution that it the reason we are having this now if because
403 doing this before elections would be out of line and doing this



404 afterwards would be pointless. Steering is made up of the most
405 experienced Senate members. If this were to come from anyone, it
406 would be them. So no, this is not a conflict of interest, its their job.

407 b. Sen. Boitmanis: (V) Regardless of the \$10,000, I am certain that these
408 will roll over. I will be senator next year and I will personally make
409 sure that that is happening.(?)... I feel like the impeachment
410 procedures should be the last item of defense. I know that I am one
411 of the youngest senators on senate right now , but during the past 5-
412 6 meetings I have been on, I feel that we didn't voice these concerns,
413 or there means of communication, instead of just impeachment as a
414 solution. We should have voice our concerns instead of just throwing
415 impeachment out on the table.

416 14.Vice President closes the second round of discussion. Shes asks that during
417 the 3rd round of discussion people should not be repetitive because there is
418 still a debate to be had.

419 15.THIRD ROUND OF DISCUSSION

420 a. Sen. Ladd: (V) The President is someone who is elected as an official
421 by the Student Body, she should know the laws better than everyone
422 else. And it is intrinsic in the nature of policies, that when you take a
423 leadership position. The senate is responsible for the action of
424 Senators. If Senators don't complete their requirments, they are
425 removed. As President of SGA is she responsible for the actions of
426 her cabinet. To say that there is no course of power is an excuse. I
427 see this as an excuse. ...(?) ... when you are an effective leader you
428 get stuff done regardless of what the constriction says about the
429 course of power. That is an excuse.

430 b. Sen. Olivarria: I would like to withdraw.

431 c. Sen. Johnson: (NV) I graduate in May and my name is on the bill.
432 there have been a lot of points brought up claiming to disclaim these
433 things in the resolution. These points do matter, this is \$10,000 that I
434 could still be giving to organizations. I am in full support of this bill.



- 435 d. Sen. Kaserman: (V)I would just like to point out that this is in no way
436 enjoyable for any of us, especially for the people who are on this
437 resolution. If you guys think that this was easy or fun or we had an
438 enjoyable time writing it, you are absolutely wrong. During the
439 steering meeting we had a member cry, I know that I personally cried
440 when I was thinking about this. Because this isn't something to be
441 taken lightly. But like I said earlier, I wouldn't have put my name on
442 this resolution if I hadn't completely agreed with it. And it's nothing
443 personal, but if we don't uphold the constitution, then who is going
444 to?
- 445 e. Sen. B. Martinez: (v)I just want to say that in I am in strong support of
446 this resolution. She had the summer to learn the ropes of how it was
447 to be a leader. That was the only time during the summer that we
448 received minutes that looked respectable, that I would put my name
449 on and say that they were taken. And to realize that you ask
450 questions when you don't know. You don't sit there and wait for
451 things to fall apart. You ask questions. That's what we are here for. If
452 you don't know, you ask questions. And the only time questions were
453 asked was at the end when she realized that she may not be able to
454 remain president next semester. And I don't think that is fair at all.
455 We have all been here, we have all been confused, we were all given
456 the constitution. We all read our duties. Her failure to adhere to
457 those duties, she should be held accountable to those. We have
458 outlined them, I have read through all the evidence and I have done
459 my job as your senator to stand in support to this resolution. She has
460 failed to be held accountable and I would urge you guys to realize
461 that she had the same opportunities as anyone else. She was well
462 compensated and never asked questions.
- 463 f. Sen. Howard: (V) A couple of quick points. First off, I regard to asking
464 questions, why didn't Senate never ask questions of President Velez
465 on 5 of the times she was required to give reports? Yes she missed



466 three meetings. Yes, she missed three meetings, but she came five
467 times. She came, reported, and no one asked any questions. Also, we
468 passed the budget by consent, so the things about the budget and
469 how much we paid the President and how much she had for salaries.
470 We passed it by consent, liked that number when we got it. In regard
471 to the \$10,000 for her executive salaries, they were set at what the
472 people were allowed to work. You have 10 hours you can work a
473 week, so we set the amount in the budget for that amount. If they
474 didn't work that amount, then we had a little extra. But if we set that
475 amount lower and they work more, then we go into the whole. If you
476 were given a job and you were given 20 hours a week to work, but
477 you didn't have to come to all those 20 hours of work if you didn't
478 want to, or if you couldn't . but then all of a sudden you try to log 20
479 hours worth or work in and your boss says, " oh we don't have any
480 money, we didn't record in our budget you could work 20 hours a
481 week and we only have enough for 10", you would like that. So that
482 fact that the executive committee didn't log the hours that they were
483 allotted to log is actually a blessing because you would have more
484 money to use later. So the fact they didn't log all those hours is a
485 good thing. And they have done a ton of work guys, and just seeing if
486 around campus , seeing the events the put on, seeing the way the
487 campus has grown in relation to Oklahoma City and the different
488 things on 23rd street that is being developed.

489 g. Sen. Olivarria: (V) Several Senators have talked about a conflict of
490 interest. I would like to put out that there is at least one member of
491 Senate that has been guaranteed a spot on Emma Valez's executive
492 branch next semester. And if that isn't a conflict of interest then I
493 don't know what is. I would also like to speak about the iPad that was
494 spent, that there was a miscommunication and a misunderstanding
495 that a third iPad was purchased. I don't understand why that iPad
496 was not immediately returned after the it was mistakenly purchased.



497 Instead you kept all three. I would like to quickly read an email that
498 was sent by Dee to her administrators above her on April 5th, which
499 was the day of the hearing. And it says :

507 All:
508 I want to make you aware in writing of some things that happened last night as I was
509 assisting Vicky Murphy and Emma Velez to gather information required for a meeting with the SGA
510 Steering Committee tonight.

511
512 Wednesday morning at 10:30 am, I was asked by Emma Velez and again by Anthony England to
513 help her gather records to present to the Steering Committee. The nature of the records are as follows:
514 Financial records, minutes from SGA exec meeting, a user contract, and a deposit slip when and if the
515 final payment was made on the Ipad purchased from SGA by Katie Alsup.

516
517 In an effort to get the financial spread sheet updated, I was in working on it last night and
518 noticed that the entry's that I had made were being deleted before my eyes and different
519 amounts put in. Harmonniey Cheadle and Corey Hill were also witness to this action.

520
521 I finally contacted the director of finance for SGA and she told me she was changing my entries
522 because the charges needed to be divided and spread out over different line items of the spread
523 sheet.

524
525 I am telling you this because I cannot with certainty attest that the data included on the Google docs
526 spreadsheet are the numbers I submitted. Also, if I am logged in, then changes can be made to look as
527 if I am the one making them. In most cases this probably means nothing but in this instance
528 where people's reputations and offices are in jeopardy, I do not want be collateral damage in the cross
529 fire between sides and I want to make you all aware as my supervisors that this has happened.

530
531 It is my primary objective to serve all the Students on SGA fairly and accurately in light of this
532 happening, I regret I can not attest to the accuracy of any numbers submitted in the SGA Google
533 docs.

551 17.Sen. Howard: is the chair aware that I am the accused, promised position
552 and that is not true...

553 18.Sen. Edwards: on order.

554 19.Sen. Howard continues after order is called. Sen. Cook informs Sen. Howard
555 that he cannot make a point with on information.

556 20.Sen. Howard: I just wanted to make you aware.

557 21.Sen. Cook: no I am not aware about anything about her cabinet. Sen.

558 Howard, please sit down. I am not aware of anything about Emma's Cabinet
559 next year. I suggest if you want to make a point, you make it during debate.

560 22.THRIST ROUND OF DISCUSSION CONTINUED

561 a. Sen. Boitmenis: (V) I have reviewed the constitution of SGA and have
562 talked to fellow senators and have come to the conclusion that the
563 allegations in the resolution are either baseless or invalid. Emma
564 Velez has not done anything that defines as misuse of funds, breach
565 of faith, or dereliction or duty. So I would encourage you all to vote
566 against the impeachment.

567 b. Sen. England: (v) In an email sent to Dee Llenusa from Vicky Murphy
568 said " we would like to return the third extra iPad because we did not
569 budget for it." That's the solution when you don't budget for
570 something. Dee Llenusa, in my interview with here, told me that
571 Emma Velez told Dee, asked Dee to go and pick up that extra iPad.
572 There was no need for it, we didn't budget for it in Senate. It is a
573 clear breach of Faith of Senate and Exec. on the through the
574 budgeting process. In the process , not a single thing was done well.
575 The payment plan that Emma Velez said on Wednesday August 24th,
576 " I spoke with Katie tonight and she is interested in buying the iPad.



577 We will set up some type of payment plan for her. It wasn't even
578 until November that a payment plan was mentioned. All three of
579 the payments in that plan were completely missed. We have no
580 evidence that Katie was even approached about those payment
581 plans, it's until February. That's more than a month, excuse me, 3
582 months after the first payment plan. That the last time anyone asked
583 her about our pay, " why where is our money?". And then the final
584 payment wasn't until the day before the hearing. Not a thing in that
585 was done well and all of that is unconstitutional and not allowed. I
586 have heard from several people, that I will now be sued for personal
587 slander because I am standing up for what I believe in. I have no
588 personal gain in doing this, I am graduating, I won't be here next
589 year. I feel like I have given countless hours to SGA and I feel that I
590 have represented the students of the school because of my hard
591 work and passion. I would never do this as a personal vendetta, I
592 have nothing to gain from it. I do not want to be here. But when I see
593 someone just blatantly disregard the rules ... I mean, after the
594 internal audit, we approached the Exec and told them that they
595 needed to do monthly reports. Three out of Emma's Cabinet didn't
596 even come once. How are we going to know what they have done if
597 they are not going to come and tell us. Emma Velez had to give the
598 report of One Give because Ryan wasn't here. And it's because of that
599 that she had no data, she had no information about that. So no, we
600 couldn't ask questions because she obviously doesn't know what her
601 cabinet members are doing. This is a gross misconduct, not because I
602 have a personal vendetta. And I will say that this is a conflict of
603 interest. Caleb Howard was also an officer on Emma Velez's
604 Campaign.

605 23. Vice President Cook closed discussion and moves to Debate.

606 24. Sen. Edwards motions to I move to allow stackable motions for one motion.



- 607 a. Sen. Edwards answers on information, stackable motions are
608 motions on top of each other in one motion.
609 b. Objection heard.
610 c. Sen. Boitmanis on information, what does that mean.
611 d. Sen. Edwards , on a parliamentary inquiry, a stackable motion as a
612 motion on top of another motion. If you want to make two motions
613 at the same time the have to be stackable. I want to recess for the
614 debate so I have to have make multiple motions to do that.
615 e. Sen. Cook: as the chair, I can just recess. Sen. Edwards would you
616 like to withdraw your motion.
617 f. Sen. Edwards: on an amendatory motion, I motion that we recess for
618 purpose of debate preparation. Seconded. Consent. Passed.

619 25.Vice President Cook recesses the trial for the purpose of caucus for 5
620 minutes before Dabate is called.

621 26.Vice President Cook informs the Senate as they are in Caucus and Sen.
622 Scheenstra, that she will be removed from the voting docket because she
623 was not present at the Secretary Ross called the roll.

624 27.Vice President Cook calls the trial back to order. (9:51 PM)

625 28.DEBATE

- 626 a. Pro- Sen. Ladd: (V) First of all I just want everyone to know, in no
627 way shape or form, do I want to do this. In no way shape or form am
628 I proud of the fact that we are here. In no way shape or form am I
629 happy that this is what we have come to. The fact that we even have
630 to do this, speaks volumes. I don't want to impeach President Velez.
631 But if this is about the good of the SGA and the good of the Student
632 Body, and honoring the governing documents that were passed
633 down to us in good faith, and honoring the by-laws that were passed
634 down to us in good faith, in the oath that we all took at inauguration
635 when we were sworn in. Then I will choose that, even if it hurts me.
636 Even if it hurts my representation, even if it hurts our relationship. I
637 was not elected to benefit myself, I was not elected to stand here



638 and think about my personal feelings. I was not elected to stand here
639 and think about what is good for Robin. I was elected to think about
640 the good of SGA and the Student Body.

641 b. Con- Sen. Boitmanis: (V) I heard the argument that we don't have to
642 be here. And we really don't have to be here because there are other
643 means to move forward, instead of the resolution. We could have
644 talked to Emma, we could have asked her questions when she was
645 here. We could have sent her an email saying, " Hey this is not really
646 right." Maybe we should have talked this through. I did not see that
647 happening. That at first this impeachment came to me as a surprise.
648 Before that, I didn't see any concerns; any concerns that the
649 legislative branch or the Executive branch had. And secondly, I would
650 like to point out that the email that was said during discussion, that
651 was sent by on the administrators about, that there was a mismatch
652 in the budget and that it was adjusted for this. We did not see that
653 email, I highly doubt the credibility of that email that was read. And I
654 haven't seen it. I really think that this case really bad and we should
655 not be here because there is no reason for us to be here.

656 c. Pro- Sen. Hottel: (V)okay the first that the opposition is bringing up
657 is that this is a surprise and an out of the blue accusation of the
658 Executive branch. But, from what I understand this is not completely
659 out of the blue. The Executive branch has been forewarned in regard
660 to the monthly meetings. There was a lot of communication going on
661 that these representatives needed to be making their monthly
662 meetings. And they are all here now, so I am just wondering, does
663 Senate only matter when we are impeaching some one? Does it take
664 the drastic action? And if the drastic action is what it take, then
665 maybe this drastic action is nessessary to show how serious we are
666 about the constitution, about the governing document that has been
667 put into place by the SGA members and for the good of the Student
668 Body as a whole. Furthermore, they are questioning the credibility of



669 the email, Dee Llenusa's email. We will all attest to the credibility of
670 that email. To say that we are now wildly fabricating emails as
671 evidence on an administrator, of OCU's administration? That is just
672 ridiculous. There is no way that we would do that and put ourselves
673 at risk in that way. So I guess what we are trying to say is that SGA
674 members, all of SGA members should be held accountable. As Robin
675 said earlier, it's implicit that when you take office that you know the
676 laws and you know what you are here to uphold. So it is the duty of
677 SGA members to know, and as Beatrice said, to ask questions. So it is
678 the duty of the SGA members to be held accountable and right now
679 that is what we are trying to do. It has also been said that these are
680 insignificant, trivial matters. But as we said, this is a matter of
681 integrity. This is a matter of seeing something wrong and standing up
682 against it. So I just would once again like to reiterate that this is in no
683 way a personal attack. Emma Velez was one of the first people that
684 reached out to me and it ment a lot, and I think that she is a great
685 wonderful person and I hope that it don't damage out relationship in
686 any way. But when I see something like this, I feel that it is my duty
687 to step up as an elected member , and a someone who is elected to
688 know the constitution of SGA. It's by duty to see to it that it is upheld
689 and if it is not , to make a point of it.

690 d. Con- Sen. G.Martinez: (V) I just want to make it give my support to
691 someone who was elected her sophomore year and won again for a
692 second term. Also I want you take into consideration and think about
693 what makes this SGA different then everyone else. And to my
694 knowledge, I don't even know if these problems has persisted in the
695 past. I feel like they have and that is why we have this new
696 constitution today. so that we can go back and get the things we saw
697 before. I think that those same problems will be addressed this year.
698 And we can look back and look at this as a learning experience. I
699 would also like to talk about Senators having constitutional



700 requirements, that we all have constitutional requirements. I would
701 like to point out that we have all required SAC events . Im not going
702 to talk about any one in particular, I'm not even for sure if I
703 completed that requirement. Yet I still stand here, a member of SGA
704 and I am without knowledge on whether or not people are have
705 done this.

706 e. Con- Sen. Howard: (V)okay I'm gonna go through each article in the
707 document and see how they do not account. Regarding the NAs
708 donation, the subject of discretionary funds is to the subject of ones
709 on discretion for any use of purpose . President Velez authorized this
710 transfer from her discretionary funds. If this is deemed a misuse of
711 funds then Senate's vote to move \$1000 of SGA's discretionary fund
712 into rolling appropriations is the same misuse of funds. Let me point
713 out that this transfer also occurred during an election period. And
714 can be seen as a way to sway votes just as well has the Presidents
715 donation. I don't think either one of these are misuse of funds.
716 Discretion means, use at your own discretion. To use the working of
717 the resolution once more, the resolution says that the President of
718 SGA circumvented the role of Senate by making this donation, then
719 Senate can be seen as circumventing the role of the budgeting
720 process. By the Sec. of Finance transferring money from the
721 discretionary, again the discretionary fund, use at your own
722 discretion. The Star Connect for allotments, yes, we have talked
723 about this. Emma agrees that they should not have applied for
724 allotments for the Spring. The amount of the money they receive for
725 Okie Fest in the fall with SGA budgeted fund, they did not receive any
726 other funds to do Okie Fest in the fall when allotments were filed.
727 They filed in the spring and got money in the spring and moneys from
728 the SGA budget. Probably shouldn't of happened, yes it was a
729 mistake it won't happen again. They are in the transitional state
730 because SGA cannot fully function as an initiative of SGA forever. It



731 has to become a student organization. This was not an intentional
732 double dipping but it has made a huge impact on international
733 relations and that is a big deal for Oklahoma City University. Salaries
734 for Cabinet members, you have to budget for the hours allowed. If
735 the account for their hours they use all of their money, if they don't
736 then we have extra. Yay, we have extra. It will be put into the rainy
737 day fund and will be used to roll over. I iPad issue, I talked to Emma, I
738 talked to other people, two iPads were authorized to be purchase,
739 accidently three were bought. So what do we do with the third one?
740 Well Emma didn't have an iPad so Emma was going to use it, then
741 her mom bought her one. So who is going to use the iPad, they can't
742 take it back. Campus tech said that, we have documents of this,
743 unreturnable. Ms. Alsup stepped up and offered to pay for it, a
744 payment plan was set up and she has paid for it. Problem averted.
745 We have the money and no deficit in the budget. The Usage
746 Agreement, in the constitution, the usage agreement is up to the
747 President to deem whether or not a Usage Agreement should be
748 necessary. She did not deem the iPads to be of significant value to
749 have a Usage Agreement because we had their B numbers and could
750 place holds. And I am out of time, please vote no. (additional time in
751 the bucket) Yes, I would like to use my full time. So, election
752 misconduct, that is double jeopardy because the electoral
753 commission said no fault. So you can't charge someone again that
754 they were deemed no fault. And then all this stuff that was in the
755 dereliction of duty , a lot of it has to do with people on her executive
756 committee. Emma has to the best of her abilities do the best that
757 they could do. They have done a lot and they have reported to
758 Senate. There was a miscommunication about the times they have to
759 report to senate. It was told to them and documented that they only
760 have to come once a semester. And then at the audit, they were like,
761 " oh no, there was actually a mess up." There is a contridictor in the



762 constitution in the by-laws and the constitution that you have the
763 right to come and give you report and not so much that you must
764 come and give your report. So after they figured that out, they
765 starting coming. And some of them didn't that was their fault, yes we
766 admit that. Is this ground for impeachment? No, it is not grounds for
767 impeachment. If there were questions, we should have brought that
768 to their attention. We should have sent them emails as Senate. We
769 could have passed a resolution asking why they were not coming and
770 talking to us. Stuff about the website doesn't exist. I was involved in
771 that. It was registered in names of people, way way long ago. Okay
772 final closing augments, yes there are things that need to be fixed.
773 People make mistakes. Reason for impeachment? I don't think so.
774 The administration that we have in one of the best in OCU's history
775 and they are going to be put to shame. We despite this document,
776 have come with proof tonight. So let it be known that if you vote yes,
777 and then if you have any problem with any of the accusations and I
778 implore you to vote and to be proud of your vote.

- 779 f. Pro- Sen. England: on information, how much time do I have?
780 i. Vice President Cook: 4 minutes and 15 seconds.
- 781 g. Pro- Sen. England: (V) okay first of all, Senate was approached about
782 one SAC event this semester. I personally worked four because I
783 worked 3 last semester. And I worked Midnight Breakfast and it was
784 the only one we were approached about. Several people had time
785 conflicts since it was just one event. And I will say that I was there, I
786 worked there and I know that at the very least, there were an equal
787 number of Senators there as SAC members. That event was through
788 in the majority by Exec. and Student Senate. So do say that Student
789 Senators haven't done their job, we have done out best. When the
790 Vice President of Student Activities hasn't made a single report to us
791 all semester, how are we supposed to know about events? How is
792 that supposed to be our responsibility? It says that in our by-laws



793 that that is his responsibility to come to us once a month to tell us
794 things like this. You can't say that, we have done the best we can. If
795 any senators were not to write two bill, I think I have been a great
796 chair of appropriations, but if I only wrote one bill I would be
797 removed too. This is nothing personal against Emma Velez. But when
798 you break the rules there has to be consequences. The only
799 consequences we have for a high officer when they blatantly break
800 the rules is impeachment. And that is what we followed. This has
801 been a three week process, where everything in the document was
802 researched and based on evidence. And if you have a question about
803 that, please come talk to me and I will show you each email that I
804 have and each document that I have as evidence say that that all
805 these things a true. I will say that I had a interview with Dee Llenusa,
806 which I have mentioned several times, and out of her own mouth she
807 said that Emma Velez said to pick up another iPad for her because
808 she was planning on buying one. If you want to call Dee Llenusa a liar
809 please do, but I think that speaks more to your credibility then to Dee
810 Llenusas' credibility. I don't think a misuse of funds occurred within
811 senate, when moneys are transferred into a budgeted account, that
812 occurs by a vote. Senate, by our constitution and by-laws Senate has
813 to approve all the allocations of funds. NAS was not allocated to, we
814 only approved the transfer of \$1000.00 that is not okay, and it was
815 during formal campaigning too, no one wants to bring that up. What
816 does that say? I think that other side has done a really good job of
817 saying what a "yes" vote counts for but I want to trust what a "no"
818 vote counts for. Voting "no" sets a precedence on the next
819 generation of Student Senators and members of SGA. If you vote
820 "no" you are clearing Emma Velez of all charges. That gives free reign
821 for future presidents to act in a similar way. Do you really want a
822 Student Body president that will unilaterally fund student
823 organizations without approval? And will change the constitution on



824 a whim to fit her own desires? And sell personal property of SGA to
825 her friends. That is not right, I don't believe that this administrations
826 has acted properly and I think that all of that is well documented.
827 And as a senator that has rationally gone through the evidence
828 against Emma Velez will see that we have an extremely valid case.
829 More valid than that brought against Matt Harney. He felt the need
830 to resign because he know that he would be implicated. He know
831 that an impeachment trial would be extremely messy and would look
832 bad on SGA. Emma Velez did not make the same decision, but I wish
833 she had. Regardless of the outcome, I am extremely happy that this
834 has happened, because now the next administration will have to
835 follow through and SGA will be permanently better for this. And I
836 applaud the efforts of my fellow members of steering and my fellow
837 members of Senate that will be voting for a better more effective
838 SGA. With that I would like to yield the rest of my time.
